## **MISSION STATEMENT AND ORGANIZATION PROFILE**

The mission of the Hispanic Counseling Center is to enhance the strengths of Long Island's families and children through bilingual, bicultural counseling, prevention, vocational, and educational services to enrich their lives, foster economic independence, and nurture dreams for the generations to come.

The Hispanic Counseling Center (HCC) is a multi-service agency with culturally competent, fully bilingual/bicultural treatment and prevention services for chemical dependency, mental illness, and youth and family services. The agency was established in 1977 by the Nassau County Department of Drug and Alcohol Addiction to provide substance abuse services to a growing Latino population in Nassau County. Services are available to anyone, regardless of race, religion, ethnicity, or economic status; no one in need is turned away due to an inability to pay or for lack of insurance. Programs include Mental Health; Chemical Dependency; Youth and Family Services; Child and Family Respite Support Services; Supported Housing for the Mentally III; Domestic Violence Prevention; Teen Drop In Center; and Mental Health Programs for People with HIV/AIDS.

Since its inception, HCC has grown from one program and four staff in a 600 square foot rental office, to ownership of a 38,000 square foot modern facility with 17 programs and a staff of 90 serving over 1,850 clients monthly in 2023.

HCC has the proud distinction of being the only agency in the region which is licensed by both the NY State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services (OASAS) and the NY State Office of Mental Health (OMH) to provide bilingual, bicultural behavioral health services. In 1986 HCC was licensed by OASAS to provide substance abuse treatment, prevention, and education services, and alcohol abuse treatment. In 1990, HCC was licensed by OMH to operate the first bilingual/ bicultural mental health outpatient treatment clinic in Nassau County.

HCC's current budget is just over \$8.6 million, with nearly half of the budget designated for mandated and contracted services as part of New York State funding to the agency, for the provision of mental health and chemical dependency services. Referrals are made to HCC in a variety of ways: the agency works closely with local hospitals and mental health outpatient clinics which refer patients under their care; with Nassau County agencies including the Department of Social Services, Child Protection Services, Family Court, the District Court, and the Probation Department; other social service agencies; local school districts including Freeport, Hempstead, Mineola, Uniondale, and Westbury; with churches and religious institutions, and with attorneys and medical providers.

HCC is well recognized in the Long Island community and throughout New York State. Agency programs demonstrate a high utilization and completion rate; the agency consistently meets funders' expectations; and the agency has historically been re-licensed for the maximum length of time. In addition to being recognized by regulating agencies and other social service providers, HCC is held in high regard by its target audience, the Hispanic and minority community population. As it has been over the past 46 years of service to Long Island, the Hispanic Counseling Center continues to be a beacon of hope for those in need.

LAWRENCE EISENSTEIN, MD, MPH, FACP

VP, Chief of Community and Public Health Catholic Health

Lawrence Eisenstein, MD, MPH, FACP, is Vice President and Chief Public and Community Health Officer for Catholic Health on Long Island. Prior to joining Catholic Health in August of 2022, Dr. Eisenstein served as Commissioner of Health for the Nassau County Department of Health, Mineola, New York for more than eleven years. Dr. Eisenstein also served as president of the New York State Association of County Health Officials (NYSACHO,) and he was on their Board of Directors for nine years.

Dr. Eisenstein is board certified in Infectious Diseases through the American Board of Internal Medicine. He completed an Internal Medicine Residency, Chief Residency, and Fellowship in Infectious Diseases at Winthrop-University Hospital in Mineola, NY. Dr. Eisenstein began his Medical Education at Universidad Autonoma de Guadalajara before finishing it at New York Medical College, Valhalla, NY. He also earned his Master of Public Health degree from New York Medical College.

Dr. Eisenstein has a long commitment to training the next generation in medicine and public health. He has been Assistant Adjunct professor at Hofstra University's Department of Health Professions and Kinesiology since 2011. Dr. Eisenstein continues to serve as Clinical Assistant Professor, Department of Family, Population & Preventive Medicine, State University of New York at Stony Brook (since 2011.)

Dr. Eisenstein has presented numerous grand rounds, guest lectures, keynote speeches, and given television, print, and other media interviews. He has received numerous honors, awards, and accolades including being named the *Bellmore Herald*'s Person of the Year in 2020, and leading the Nassau County Department of Health to the "Health Department of the Year Award" awarded by the National Association of County and City Health Officials in 2018. Dr. Eisenstein was named to the New York State Ending the Epidemic Taskforce, and following Superstorm Sandy Dr. Eisenstein served his community by being appointed by the Governor as Community Rising Co-Chairman for the Bellmore/Merrick community. He lives in Bellmore, NY with his wife and daughters.





**HOSSAM MAKSOUD, PharmD** 

Chief Executive Officer Community Care Rx

Hossam Maksoud, PharmD, is the Chairman and Founder of Community Care Rx, a unique pharmacy that provides comprehensive pharmacy services to assisted living facilities, skilled nursing facilities, OPWDD residential facilities and other long-term-care providers. Mr. Maksoud holds a Bachelor of Science in pharmacy from St. John's University. In 1993, he established Maksoud Pharm Inc., a chain of independent retail pharmacies in the New York metropolitan area. He later launched Community Care Rx, based in Plainview, N.Y., with offices in Totowa, N.J. The company, with more than 150 employees, provides pharmaceutical services to the tristate area and beyond.

Recently, Mr. Maksoud established Community Care Specialty Pharmacy which works with the entire healthcare ecosystem to connect patients with chronic and rare conditions to medication, information, and financial assistance. Mr. Maksoud and his team have special expertise providing services to patients who have catastrophic health conditions and the company bolstered its specialty pharmacy services with the acquisition of Orphan Pharmacy Services in Syosset, NY.

In 2018, Mr. Maksoud and partners co-founded Dawah Pharmaceuticals Inc. The goal of the company, of which Mr. Maksoud serves as CEO, is to design and build an FDA-compliant pharmaceutical manufacturing facility to address the need for high-quality products in the global sterile injectable and ophthalmology marketplace.

In all of his endeavors, Mr. Maksoud focuses on providing clients with excellent and dependable customer service. To further assist nonprofits and the individuals they support, Mr. Maksoud recently launched The Maksoud Foundation. The foundation's mission is to provide financial and other support to organizations that assist seniors and individuals with developmental, intellectual and psychological disabilities.

I was a victim of a hate crime and because of that, I started having panic attacks and feeling extreme distrust of everyone around me. As a result, I feel very relaxed, and eager to succeed, and I am confident that nothing can stop me from achieving my goals. The COMHPS program for me means support, trust, and love.

**K** In the process of my daughter that receives help with Andrea Ortiz, I have seen changes in her. Now she is a girl who can participate in the group, give her opinion, and has bettered her emotions with the help given by Andrea. She is past being a timid and quiet girl and is now more cheerful and happy. She enjoys the little things about life like going to the park and being around other children. When she joined this program she had many fears and problems with communication but little by little with the help she is receiving she has been a lot better. All I want to say now is thank you Hispanic Counseling Center, thank you very much.

**66** The Hispanic Counseling Center has helped me tremendously. When I first met my therapist I was nervous because I have never been in therapy before. In our first appointment she made me feel comfortable and I could tell that she was truly listening to me. I was in a rough situation at home. My therapist has helped me realize my worth. I feel that I am now more independent, I have found a job and I am currently working on getting a new place for me and my son. My therapist has introduced me to meditation and has shown me the importance of expressing my feelings. My therapist has also referred me to women's groups, which has motivated me to share my story. I am very thankful for my therapist and the Hispanic Counseling Center.

**ff** I want to express how grateful I am for the Respite program that has had a huge impact on my child's life. My child has been dealing with bullying at school... however, since going to the Respite group, I've noticed a remarkable change in their confidence, social skills, and overall well-being. The Respite program has created a safe and supportive place where my child can freely express themselves and connect with other kids who are going through similar challenges. Being part of a group has been really helpful in helping my child overcome their fear and anxiety about bullying. They feel like they belong and realize they're not alone in what they're going through.**??** 

**G** I would like to express my gratitude to the Respite program for being an incredible support for my family. I have four children, and one of them has special needs and requires a lot of support. Without the guidance of the Respite program, I would have never been as knowledgeable about my son's diagnosis as I am today, and I wouldn't have been able to maintain a balance in my home. The Respite program has been there for my family during our toughest times. They consistently provide us with donations of food, clothes, and even furniture when we need them. My children are always thrilled to attend the group because it's their chance to have fun, and I can also have some personal time.

I am truly grateful for the Respite program's support and assistance. They have lifted my family up and made a significant difference in our lives.

**66** I want to thank this program which has been a blessing to me and my family as they have been of great support. As immigrants, most of the time we do not know of resources or where to go for medical attention and treatment. This program has helped me and my family in many ways.

We also have a resident who has enrolled in therapy and psychiatry at HCC and she enjoys having support from professionals who understand her language and her cultural background.
