MISSION STATEMENT AND ORGANIZATION PROFILE

The mission of the Hispanic Counseling Center is to enhance the strengths of Long Island's families and children through bilingual, bicultural counseling, prevention, vocational, and educational services to enrich their lives, foster economic independence, and nurture dreams for the generations to come.

The Hispanic Counseling Center (HCC) is a multi-service agency with culturally competent, fully bilingual/bicultural treatment and prevention services for chemical dependency, mental illness, and youth and family services. The agency was established in 1977 by the Nassau County Department of Drug and Alcohol Addiction to provide substance abuse services to a growing Latino population in Nassau County. Services are available to anyone, regardless of race, religion, ethnicity, or economic status; no one in need is turned away due to an inability to pay or for lack of insurance. Programs include Mental Health; Chemical Dependency; Youth and Family Services; Child and Family Respite Support Services; Supported Housing for the Mentally III; Domestic Violence Prevention; Teen Drop-In Center; and Mental Health Programs for People with HIV/AIDS.

Since its inception, HCC has grown from one program and four staff in a 600 square foot rental office, to ownership of a 38,000 square foot modern facility with 17 programs and a staff of 90 serving over 1,850 clients monthly in 2025.

HCC has the proud distinction of being the only agency in the region which is licensed by both the NY State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services (OASAS) and the NY State Office of Mental Health (OMH) to provide bilingual, bicultural behavioral health services. In 1986 HCC was licensed by OASAS to provide substance abuse treatment, prevention, and education services, and alcohol abuse treatment. In 1990, HCC was licensed by OMH to operate the first bilingual/bicultural mental health outpatient treatment clinic in Nassau County.

HCC's current budget is just over \$9.3 million, with nearly half of the budget designated for mandated and contracted services as part of New York State funding to the agency, for the provision of mental health and chemical dependency services. Referrals are made to HCC in a variety of ways: the agency works closely with local hospitals and mental health outpatient clinics which refer patients under their care; with Nassau County agencies including the Department of Social Services, Child Protection Services, Family Court, the District Court, and the Probation Department; other social service agencies; local school districts including Freeport, Hempstead, Mineola, Uniondale, and Westbury; with churches and religious institutions, and with attorneys and medical providers.

HCC is well recognized in the Long Island community and throughout New York State. Agency programs demonstrate a high utilization and completion rate; the agency consistently meets funders' expectations; and the agency has historically been re-licensed for the maximum length of time. In addition to being recognized by regulating agencies and other social service providers, HCC is held in high regard by its target audience, the Hispanic and minority community population. As it has been over the past 48 years of service to Long Island, the Hispanic Counseling Center continues to be a beacon of hope for those in need.

James Lentini, D.M.A., began his appointment as Molloy University's seventh president in June 2020. Under his leadership and vision, Molloy has moved from college to university status, achieved record enrollment numbers, and earned status as a Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI). Dr. Lentini led the development of Molloy's new strategic plan, focused on meeting the needs the New York metropolitan region for traditional college goers and adult learners. In partnership with businesses and healthcare systems, Molloy has developed high-demand workforce development programs to augment traditional academic pathways.

Prior to his appointment at Molloy, Dr. Lentini served as Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost at Oakland University, where he played a key role in the establishment of a new medical school. As professor of music at Wayne State University in his hometown of Detroit, Michigan, he created a highly successful degree program in Music Technology. Dr. Lentini also served as Dean of the School of Creative arts at Miami University and as Founding Dean of the College of Arts and Communication at The College of New Jersey.

In addition to his executive leadership, Dr. Lentini is an internationally recognized composer. He is a recipient of the Andrés Segovia International Composition Prize, among many accolades. Pulitzer Prize panelist Howard Reich of the Chicago Tribune named Dr. Lentini's recording entitled "Through Time and Place" one of the Best Classical Recordings of the Year for 2020.

Dr. Lentini currently serves as a Board member of the Long Island Association. He is First Vice Chair for the Commission on Independent Colleges and Universities and is the Chair of the Dominican Higher Education Council. Dr. Lentini was named to a list of "Power 25 in Education" by Long Island Business News in 2020 and was included on the Long Island Press "Power List" in 2021 and 2022.

HCC SERVICES AND PROGRAMS AT A GLANCE

BEHAVIORAL HEALTH PROGRAMS

Mental Health Outpatient Clinic

Treatment services for children ages five and older, adolescents, adults, seniors, and families:

- Individual, family, and group therapy
- Psychiatric evaluations
- Medication management
- Services for victims and children exposed to domestic violence

Substance Use Outpatient Program

Treatment services for individuals recovering from drug and alcohol related problems:

- Individual, family, and group counseling
- Crisis and family intervention
- Psycho-educational series
- Psychiatric evaluations, toxicology exams, and medical screenings
- Prevention services and education

Community Mental Health Promotion and Support (COMHPS)

Provides short-term counseling in order to establish, maintain, and improve individual and community mental health and wellness:

- Free and confidential
- Referrals to licensed MH professionals
- Brief counseling and emotional support
- Individual and group support

State Opioid Response (SOR) IV Program

Program for at risk youth and their families to increase awareness of opioid and substance use problems:

- Evidence-based prevention workshops
- Prevention information and referrals
- Tools and strategies to avoid drug use

Ryan White Mental Health Program

Provides treatment services for those who are affected by HIV/AIDS and are not eligible for other insurance:

- Individual and family counseling
- Referrals for evaluation and medication

Domestic Violence Batterer's Intervention Program

Serves individuals who are referred by courts, child welfare agencies, and other sources due to charges stemming from domestic violence and child abuse:

- Twenty-six week psycho-educational program to reduce potential for family violence
- Education on legal implications and the effect of violence on family members

SUPPORT SERVICES PROGRAMS

Health Home Care Coordination for Adults

Provides case management services to adults with serious behavioral and/or physical issues:

- Helps individuals navigate the health care system
- Services include support for financial, health, housing, and educational needs

Regional Prevention and Support Services Initiative

Provides services to individuals who are at risk of, or are living with HIV/AIDS:

- HIV/STI/Hep-C prevention and support
- PrEP/PEP education and screening
- Informal counseling, education on HIV related issues, and other assistance

Supportive Housing Program

Provides advocacy for adults with a serious mental illness diagnosis to prevent homelessness and provide permanent housing:

- Financial assistance with rent, utilities and home furnishings
- Referrals to community resources necessary to maintain independent living



YOUTH AND FAMILY SERVICES

Family Peer Support and Respite Services

Provides weekly temporary care of children with emotional and behavioral issues to give parents and caretakers a period of rest in care-giving:

- Family and peer support
- Social skills and recreational activities
- Parent educational workshops and advocacy for children

Youth and Family Program/ Teen Drop-In Center (TDIC)

Serves youth ages 12-17 and offers supervised informal learning during the critical after-school and early evening hours:

- Homework help, computer literacy, peer mentoring, counseling, and prevention workshops
- Educational workshops for parents

Empire After-School Program

Program offered in collaboration with Hempstead High School for newly arrived students and their parents:

- ESL/ENL, math and literacy tutoring
- Informal counseling and support
- Education and information

Parenting Education Program and Greentree Foundation "Good Neighbor" Fund

Program for parents to maintain a healthy relationship and improve parenting skills and overall communication with their children:

- Education on respect, communication, effective discipline skills, self-esteem, and more
- Child abuse and neglect education
- Evidence-based program



The Impact of the Hispanic Counseling Center Expressed in the Words of HCC Program Clients

In the words of a COMHPS Program client:

I am happy to belong to the MAPAS support group. In these group meetings, we learn to strengthen emotional well-being. It guides us, provides us with tools, like setting boundaries, to face the daily challenges of a full and productive life. Our guides, Diana and Carolina, listen to us and look for ways to help us. They connect us when we need support for our problems. In my daily life, I put into practice the teachings of this group both at home and in my community. Thank you for creating this space where mental health is essential, helping us face stress, anxiety, depression, and improve personal relationships.

In the words of a Mental Health Outpatient Clinic client:

I'm someone who has been receiving mental health therapy. When I first heard that word, I thought to myself, "Well, I'm not crazy." That's what many of us think when we don't have any information about the topic. But the truth is, we have no idea how important it is to overcome certain stages in our lives. I started therapy about a year ago. Honestly, it was really hard for me to accept that I urgently needed it. Like many people who come to this country looking for a better future, we leave everything behind and go through very tough and unfair situations—situations we often can't talk about or face, whether out of fear, shame, or even threats. And so, we stay silent.

Now I know—and I live it—that life is beautiful when there's peace and love inside of us. I still go to therapy. I'm no longer the same. I'm focused on new things, motivated because I know I can. Now, I can cry from happiness, and I thank God and all those people who have the gift of offering help. I'm very grateful to my therapist, and I always tell her—and will keep telling her—thank you for listening to me when I needed it the most!

In the words of Respite Program clients:

- **66** The Respite Program has been a true blessing for our family. My child has grown more confident and social since joining. I feel at peace knowing they are in a safe, supportive environment.
- If The Respite Program has taken us on so many trips that I never could've done on my own. My kids got to experience things I never imagined they would, and my family and I made moments we'll never forget. I'm so thankful for everything they've done for us.
- Gevery week, the Respite Program brings me clothes, food, and things I need for my home. I'm so grateful for everything they do. I always look forward to that knock on my door—they never forget about me. I would truly be in need if they didn't come. I also love going on the activities and trips with my kids. We get to bond and enjoy time together in ways we normally wouldn't. One of our favorite trips was Cirque du Soleil—it was an experience we'll never forget. We really appreciate everything the program has done for us.



MONICA MORALES

PIX 11 Reporter Host, "Monica Makes It Happen"

Monica Morales is a seven-time Emmy Award-winning investigative reporter for PIX11 News, where she anchors the "Monica Makes It Happen" segment weekdays at 5:45 p.m. Known for her impactful advocacy journalism, Morales is one of the few reporters in the nation dedicated to covering public housing issues in the United States.

In addition to her daily reporting, Morales hosts the "Monica Makes It Happen" TV show, supported by JPMorgan Chase and Goya Foods. The show tackles pressing issues such as food insecurity and human trafficking, while also uplifting underserved communities through strategic partnerships, funding, and scholarships via Goya Cares. Morales also launched the "Monica Makes It Happen" Podcast in 2025, where she interviews celebrities, CEOs, and changemakers about financial empowerment—covering how to make, save, and invest money.

A proud advocate for the Hispanic community, Morales was elected to the Board of Governors of the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences New York Chapter in 2024. She is the recipient of the 100 Hispanic Women Community Service Award, the Ellis Island Medal of Freedom for immigrant advocacy, and was named a Latina of Distinction by El Diario Nueva York. She serves on the board of Casa de las Américas at LaGuardia Community College and the Advisory Council of the Ellis Island Honors Society.

Her work has been profiled by the Columbia Journalism Review, and her 2020 TED Talk, "Moms Make It Happen," focused on the power of women driving change in their communities. Morales credits her late mother, Maria Teresa Morales, a Bolivian immigrant who worked three jobs to support her family, as her lifelong inspiration.

Morales' reporting has earned her a National Emmy for Breaking News, six local Emmys, and an Edward R. Murrow Award. Her "Monica Makes It Happen" series won a Continuing Coverage Emmy in 2020 and garnered Community Service Emmy in 2024 and nominations in 2021 and 2022 for her persistent coverage of New York City's housing crisis.
